## Volunteers donate work in county Day of Caring

Across Butler County on Thursday a number of employees showed up in jeans and T-shirts instead of suits and skirts.

And they failed to report to work.

But that was OK because they were volunteers for the United Way of Butler County's 12th Day of Caring.

Several hundred volunteers spent the day cleaning, repairing, digging, painting and doing other tasks to help neighbors and nonprofit organizations.

They included NextTier Bank volunteers who painted much of the Victims Outreach Intervention Center.

About 14 Penreco workers showed up at the Butler County Children's Center in Chicora to clean and organize storage areas and to paint furniture, and 12 employees from Butler County Community College traveled to the Passavant Retirement Community in Zelienople to price items for a flea market and clean the grounds.

Today the events continue as more than 800 MEDRAD employees who work at facilities in Allegheny, Butler and Westmoreland counties fan out for additional projects, including the Breakfast of Champions event at the Cranberry Place Nursing Facility in Cranberry Township this morning.

Through the years, thousands of Butler County workers have helped the county's nonprofit agencies get chores done and to reach out to their neighbors on the annual Day of Caring.
